

Is eczema impacting your daily life?



Learn more about the PossibLity Study

The symptoms of atopic dermatitis (AtD, which is often also referred to as eczema) can be difficult to manage. Severe itching, skin rashes, cracked, inflamed, thick, rough, and leathery skin, or hyperpigmentation can make daily life difficult for those living with AtD, even when using different medications or creams to help.

Introducing the PossibLity Study

The PossibLity Study is evaluating the effectiveness, safety, pharmacokinetics (how the drug moves through the body) and pharmacodynamics (what the drug does in the body) of an investigational drug called galvokimig in people with atopic dermatitis.

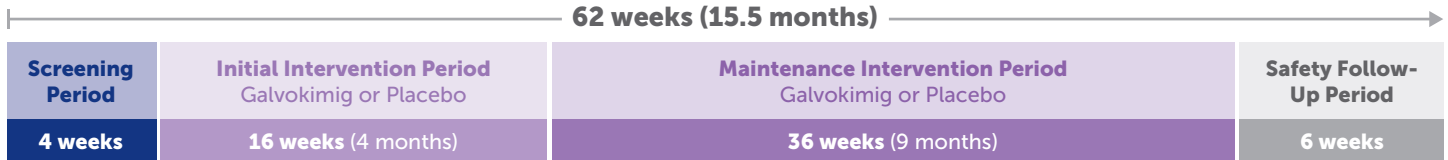
Galvokimig is designed to work by stopping certain proteins of the immune system from working. The immune system is the body's natural defense system. These proteins are called interleukin-13 (IL-13) and interleukin-17 (IL-17), and they are known to cause inflammation or swelling that can lead to eczema. Researchers think that by stopping IL-13 and IL-17 from working, people could have less inflammation and an improvement in their eczema.



Participation in the PossibLity Study

The study will last a maximum of about 62 weeks (15.5 months), with up to 30 study visits. The PossibLity Study will include 4 periods:

- **Screening Period:** About 4 weeks
- **Two Intervention Periods:** About 52 weeks (1 year) total, divided between:
 - Initial Intervention Period: 16 weeks (4 months)
 - Maintenance Intervention Period: 36 weeks (9 months)
- **Safety Follow-Up Period:** 6 weeks



Who is eligible for the PossibLity Study?

To qualify for this study, participants must:

- Be at least 18 years old
- Have been diagnosed with atopic dermatitis for at least 12 months
- Have more than 10% of their skin currently affected by atopic dermatitis (the palm of one hand is about 1% of body surface area)
- Have used topical medications (e.g., medicated creams or ointments) for atopic dermatitis in the past 6 months that were not entirely satisfactory

There are other requirements that need to be met to join the PossibLity Study, which the study staff will discuss with the potential participants. Reimbursement for study-related travel and expenses can be made available.
